A Typical Lesson Plan to Teach Phonics to Young Learners

Objectives:

At the end of this lesson students should be able to:

- 1. Say the name of the letters and their corresponding sounds correctly.
- 2. Say some meaningful words that contain the sounds.

Warm up:

- 1. Recalling words/action words from the previous lesson (Using a game or a song).
- 2. Checking homework.
- 3. Introduce the content of the current lesson.

Presentation:

(Introducing the letters/Sounds)

- 1. Giving the name of each letter in uppercase & lowercase form.
- 2. Presenting the sound with the name of the letter.
- 3. Using picture & word cards pointing to the letter, saying the sound and showing the meaning.

Practice:

(Students practice the Letters/Sounds)

- 1. Writing the letter on the board, pointing to it, naming it and asking students to repeat.
- 2. Asking students to write it on board (in front of the class) and then on their notebook.
- 3. Asking students to look at the pictures, listen to the recording (or the tape script), and repeat the letter's name, its sound and the words including the sound pointing to each word.

Saying the words including the sounds randomly, students repeat and point to each word.

Finish the lesson:

- 1. Playing a song including the target sounds, students repeat line by line and point to the corresponding pictures.
- 2. Asking students to sing the song by themselves.
